COURSE OVERVIEW

Over a series of five modules, this course provides learners the opportunity to learn about best practices for palliative and end-of-life care for clients and their families. Using a holistic framework to understand the dying process, learners will explore concepts from advance care planning to the last hours of life through death, grief, and bereavement. Students will learn how to provide care that is culturally relevant and honors the choices, traditions, and values of the dying and their families.

- Utilize reflection to identify their own beliefs about death and dying
- Identify cultural approaches to end-of-life care
